Definition of a Probationary Member

Probationary Members

A probationary member is the transition period to become a member. Any person that wishes to take up archery (presents at an ABA Affiliated Club) has up to three months to become a member of the Australian Bowhunters Association (the three months being a probation period).

During the probation period, newcomers can participate in come and try days that are supervised by qualified ABA Coaches. When the newcomer is assessed as competent by the Club Coach, they may under supervision by a Club Coach or Senior Competent Club Member use the practice ranges, shooting ranges and participate in club shoots.

After the three month probationary period the probationary membership will no longer be valid and the probationary member(s) will be required to hold a financial ABA Membership to participate in any further ABA club activities.

Probationary Membership is only available at Club Level, Probationary Members cannot participate or compete in Branch, State or National competitions.

A club must be keeping record of probationary members, and they must be signing in and out when they attend the club.

Prior members of ABA and those that have previously completed a Probation Period are not eligible for probationary membership.
